<p>Talks about why things happen and how things work</p> <p>Shows an interest in technological toys with knobs or pulleys, or real objects such as cameras or mobile phones</p> <p>Shows skill in making toys work by pressing parts or lifting flaps to achieve effects such as sound, movements, or new images</p>	<p>Link to Reception-Toys Link to Y1-Transport</p> <p>Moving toys</p> <p>Some toys can help us learn new things.</p> <p>On some toys, we can press things to make them work.</p> <p>They can make sounds, move or spin around when we press a button or lift a flap or pull a lever.</p> <p>Some books have flaps to lift up so we can see a new picture or make the picture move.</p> <p>Some toys have wheels. They look like cars, trucks, trains or buses.</p> <p>Wheeled toys can move if you push them.</p> <p>We can build a track for wheeled toys to move around on. If we push them with our hands they will move.</p>	<p>Talk about how moving toys work.</p> <p>Show how to make a toy move by pressing a button or lifting a flap.</p> <p>Make an image move in a book by lifting a flap.</p>
